Mill Manager Tony Hobson and his team gave a plant tour and briefed U.S. Representative Ralph Norman (R-SC), South Carolina State Sen. It was a pleasure to provide them with a first-hand account of our ongoing efforts to address complaints about unpleasant odors.

We may have been slow to respond publicly to concerns raised by nearby residents when we initially transformed mill operations earlier this year. But we have been working hard over the past five months to improve the situation.

New-Indy Catawba is committed to cooperating with regulators and working with the Community Engagement Group to resolve the situation.

The data continue to verify that our efforts are working. As we disclose on this website every day, monitors confirm that hydrogen sulfide emissions at our fence line are minimal and in surrounding communities, on most days, zero. Our goal is to continue this trend so that York County and the surrounding area continue to be great places to live, work, and raise a family.
