**New-Indy gives Christian Services \$5,000 and food donations**  
***Funds will help pay for a new electric generator for the food pantry***

**Lancaster, S.C.** –New-Indy Catawba employees visited Christian Services of Lancaster County today and mill manager Tony Hobson presented a \$5,000 check to executive director Eric Kramer. The money will help Christian Services buy an electric generator for its food pantry to prolong the shelf life of perishable food when it loses power.

New-Indy and Christian Services started a dollar-for-dollar match campaign up to \$5,000 on Dec. 6 on Christian Services' website. Total donations from the community exceeded \$1,500. Still, New-Indy donated the full \$5,000 to help Christian Services meet its goal of buying the new generator.

In addition, New-Indy Catawba employees conducted a food drive for Christian Services at the mill. Food donations totaled more than 600 pounds. The food collected was delivered to Christian Services today.

New-Indy is a world-class integrated virgin linerboard and market pulp manufacturing mill in Catawba, S.C. Christian Services is a local nonprofit organization dedicated to combating hunger in Lancaster County. Christian Services accepts food items including rice, pasta, canned goods, bread, flour, cereal, fruit cups, cereal bars, Pop-Tarts, peanut butter, jelly, canned soup, granola bars, dried beans, Rice-A-Roni, Hamburger Helper, canned tuna, and boxed macaroni.
