NEW-INDY CATAWBA SUPPORTS LOCAL EDUCATION

New-Indy is proud to partner with the [Foundation for Rock Hill Schools](#), a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting public education in our community. In December, New-Indy funded a teacher-requested grant for the Lesslie Elementary School to build an outdoor classroom. Mill representatives presented the check to the teachers, school administrators, and students who will benefit from the new space.



The Foundation for Rock Hill Schools' Back-the-Pack Program helps feed hundreds of children each week.

New-Indy also supported the foundation's Back-the-Pack program, a student-led initiative that feeds more than 850 children each weekend. The program is run by high school students who are taught by a former mill employee.

Catawba Junction Wildlife is a local nonprofit organization dedicated to rescuing, rehabilitating, and releasing native wildlife while providing sanctuary for farm animals in need. 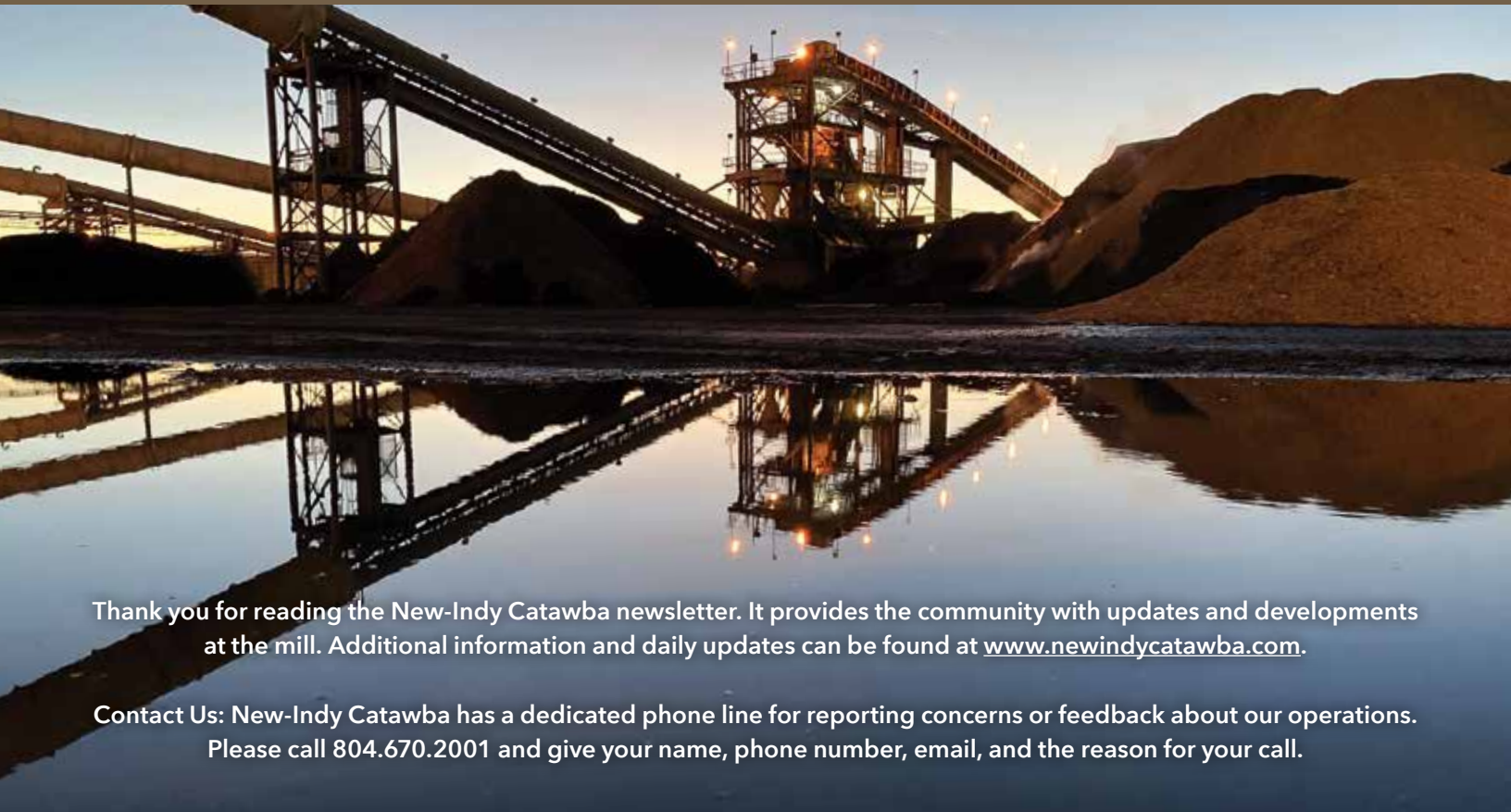

ABOUT NEW-INDY CATAWBA

New-Indy Catawba is a world-class integrated virgin linerboard and pulp manufacturing mill located on the Catawba River. The facility opened in 1959 and began operation as New-Indy Catawba in 2019. The mill produces a lightweight linerboard used in corrugated packaging and unbleached pulp for other applications.

The facility supports the livelihoods of more than 400 hard-working men and women and their families as well as hundreds of indirect regional jobs in logging, chemical and material supply, and transportation. In addition, New-Indy Catawba has partnered with the U.S. Department of Labor and York Technical College to develop an accredited apprenticeship program.
